## **Rare Birds**

In Stepps we have had our fare share of rare birds visiting Frankfeild Loch. Some of the rare birds visiting are:



American Robin - Migrates because the ground freezes over stopping them from getting to their favourite foods so they migrate to find food elsewhere.



The Blue Winged Teal - Is an American/ Canadian bird and rarely ever turns to come to the UK. This bird visited Frankfeild loch for 6 weeks between June and July 2019 before going home.



Canadian Geese - Come here to have their families.



Martens - Come to us from the Sahara to breed before going home again.



Swallow - Come here from Asia to have their families before going back for the winter.

Swifts - Come here from South Africa to breed before going back home.
